Learning Objectives

- What You Will Learn from Watching 'Uproar'

- You will be able to talk about what is needed to feel that you truly belong somewhere.
- You will learn how to provide a summary of the movie.
- You will be able to identify and explain the central problems and conflicts in the film related to identity, belonging, sport and national identity.
- You will explore Josh's struggle with identity and his journey to discover who he is.
- You will understand the importance of having beliefs and how Josh learns to stand up for what he believes is right.
- You will learn what apartheid was and how it affected people in South Africa and beyond.
- You will explore Māori culture
- You will discover how films use music, lighting and other cinematic techniques to tell a story and convey emotions.

Introduction

Uproar is a coming-of-age film set in New Zealand in 1981. The story follows 17-year-old Josh Waaka, a boy who feels different and unsure about where he belongs.





Josh is half-Māori and half-European, and he lives with his mother and older brother. He attends to a strict boys' school where rugby is everything – but Josh dreams of something else.

At the same time, there are large protests across the country because the South African rugby team is visiting. Many people are angry because South Africa still enforces apartheid – a system that separates people based on race.

As the world around him begins to change, Josh must decide: Who is he? What does he believe in? And will he stay quiet – or stand up for what he feels is right?
